### **This week**

Our Local Authority attendance officer visited school this week. She was pleased to see that for the majority of children their attendance has improved or has remained at a good level of attendance. Where children's attendance is below 95% and not improving, I will continue to inform you and to offer support to prevent you receiving a fixed penalty notice.

### **Comic Relief**

Thank you if you have started sending your 1p and 2p's in to school to raise money for comic relief. Next Friday 15<sup>th</sup> children can wear their pyjamas and/or have a funny hairstyle. If you would like to make a donation to comic relief please do but children are bringing coins in which is supporting Comic Relief.

A parent has shared some ideas for fundraising. We are going to start with fundraising linked to Mother's Day. If you could send your child in with a small gift e.g. small candle, bubble bath, chocolates by Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March. On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> March the children can bring in £1 to choose a present for their mum, nan or any special female relative which they will then be able to wrap and bring home.



### **Parking-traffic wardens**

Please remember to park safely and drive slowly on both Oxhey Drive and Northwick Road. Unfortunately, a few cars are still parking on the pavements making it dangerous for parents and children on their way to and from school. There will be an increase in police and traffic wardens on both roads so please park carefully for the safety of our children and to avoid a parking ticket. Thank you for your support with this.

We are reminding children that there is never an excuse for swearing or spitting in school. All children are aware that if they do swear or spit they will spend time with an adult reflecting on their behaviour.

### **Water Bottles**

Following on from a query by a parent this week I would just like to clarify that children should only have water in their bottles they drink from in class; this is not a school rule but follows the nutrition expectations by the Department for Education with the aim of preventing tooth decay. Thank you for your support with this.



### **Help in school**

We are always grateful of any help in school; this can be for reading, helping on trips, cooking, art or with fundraising. If you would like to help please ask at the office so that we can complete a DBS check for you. When we go on school trips we take school staff as far as possible but often still need some help. In following health and safety guidance where possible we avoid parents going on trips with their child's class.

### **Head lice**

Head lice unfortunately enjoy visiting children's hair. Please check your child's hair regularly to check for any eggs or live lice. If you would like any advice on how to treat head lice please ask at the school office or speak to Jules.

### **Smoking**

Can parents please refrain from smoking around the school gates and be mindful where they dispose their cigarettes.



### **Communication**

Please remember if you have a question or concern please come in and ask your child's teacher or one of the leadership team. I would much rather you ask a small question or concern so that it can be answered or dealt with sooner rather than you worrying about something. If you can't come into school, please telephone or email the school office or your child's teacher. A member of Senior Leadership Team will be outside in the morning if you need to speak to someone. If your email is for me I respond normally the same day that it has been passed to me. If ever you email in, get no response please come and ask as it maybe your email has gone into our junk mail.

We have had some concerns raised by parents where another parent has told them something has happened. Please do come in and ask as we can then investigate this for you. Please do not approach other parents as this can cause upset and distress to parents and children.

I am always grateful to receive feedback from parents as we can't share reasons or think about further improvements without this. It maybe that at times a parent may disagree with an aspect of school or how school has dealt with something; any decision we make is always to support the children and I am always happy to share the reasons with parents.

If you do need to talk to your child's class teacher or any adult in school please can I remind all parents that shouting or rudeness will not be tolerated.

We are very lucky to have a great staff team who are committed to supporting your child's learning and emotional development. I want the best for every child in school and this includes good attendance. Thank you for your ongoing support for the staff team and your child's good attendance in school.

### **Stay and Learn and Reading Breakfasts**

Over the school year classes in Years 1-6 will be holding stay and learn and reading breakfasts where you are invited to join in practical activities for stay and learn and for reading breakfasts to enjoy a book with your child over a light breakfast.



### **Break time Snacks**

We endeavour to promote healthy eating at break times, we have noticed that some children are bringing in packets of crisps and chocolate bars. We ask that you do not send your child into school with unhealthy snacks and swap them for fruit, raisins, rice cakes, fruit bars.

### **Parking and Safety**

If you drive into school to drop your child at breakfast club or to collect from after school club, please park in the spaces on the left hand side as you drive through the gate. Please do not park in the wider section by the main doors. Hopefully if parents remember to park in these spaces we will not need to lock the gates at other times.

Please do not park opposite the school gates as our Lollipop Lady cannot see all oncoming traffic which puts our children's safety at risk. The local police have said they will try as often as possible to spend time outside school to encourage parents to park safely. If you park too near the junction with Gosforth Lane this could lead to a parking ticket.

### **Safeguarding and health and safety including online safety**

We have some children in school with severe allergies. Please do not bring dogs onto school grounds.

We take safeguarding very seriously in school as we want every child to feel safe in school. If you need to come into school for any reason please come in via the school office so that you have signed in. We have updated our child protection policy and new safeguarding guidelines expect schools to have at least 2 contact numbers for every child in school. Please can you make sure you have given 2 phone numbers to the school and update these if you change your number.

If you are concerned about the safety of any children we have 4 designated safeguarding leads in school: Jules Riding, Mrs Morley, Mrs Caplan and Miss Douglas-Law-please share any concerns with them or please ring 0300 1234043

### **After School and Breakfast Club**

To ensure our financial system aligns with all other MAT schools all sessions for breakfast and after school club must be made in advance before a child can attend. Please ask at the school office for information. We currently use parent mail for payments as this offered best value for money. Please so let me know if you have any problems with using this and I will look into it.

## **Attendance- OVER 95%!!!**

Thank you to the majority of parents who have supported their children in coming to school regularly. For the first time in over 5 years' attendance is now at just over 95%. Nearly every child returned to school on Tuesday which is fantastic! This is really supporting the children's progress in school.

If, despite informing you of low attendance and offering support your child's attendance continues to be of concern you will receive a letter to each parent stating that you are at risk of a penalty notice being applied.

Please support your child by ensuring your child comes to school every day not just for their learning but also for their social development. If there is any support you need or would like to discuss how to improve your child's attendance please don't hesitate to contact me.

## **School Lunches**

Next week is week 3. If your child brings in a packed lunch please make sure they do not bring in peanut butter sandwiches or Nutella as we have children with severe allergies. Children in Years Reception to Year 2 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals and can have a free school lunch every day.

## **Punctuality**

Please could you support your child by making sure they arrive on time. It is unsettling for them if they arrive after the lesson has started. This will also be monitored by the Local Authority Attendance Officer.



## **Open Door Policy**

Please remember we have an open door policy; teachers are happy to meet with parents before and after school, please email the teacher or ask them at the end of the day. I am always happy to meet with parents or talk on the phone as it is important that you feel listened to and sometimes events shared are slightly different to what has happened in school. We do have some parents that work in school but please avoid putting them in a difficult position by asking them about information within school. It is important that staff and parents trust each other and I take confidentiality very seriously. If you have a concern please speak to your child's class teacher or a member of leadership team; Mrs Caplan, Miss Jennings, Mrs Kent, Miss Douglas-Law or myself.

## **School Uniform and Ordering**

We are now set up online for school uniform ordering. There is a link on the school uniform page on the school website that takes you to the site, we also sent instructions out to you on an email. If you would like a hard copy please contact the school office. We do still have some stock in school but have limited sizes.

Please make sure your child wears the correct school uniform to school including black shoes not trainers and school blue or plain black hair bows. This helps children have a sense of belonging in school.

School uniform is trousers, shorts, skirts, pinafores, please do not send your child to school wearing leggings.
