2. Today we are reading the next chapters of Varjak Paw – chapters 9 – 11. Use the link <https://www.loom.com/share/5bdb4c46be684e9485bcd8d02bf4bb0e> , watch the video and answer the questions and activities below

a. What happens at the start of the chapter? Who is it and how does Varjak respond? Find the descriptions of her.

b. How does Varjak convince her that he is not part of a gang?

c. What happens in his next dream in chapter 10?

d. Who is Tam? What does she look like? What do you think of her?

e. Writing Challenge – Varjak learns about the Vanishings. Find all the information you can that Holly shares about the gangs and the Vanishings and using these clues predict what is happening and what you think is going to happen next.

3. Museum – Today is all about making your own magic. You need to create a spell or potion for your witch/wizard to use. You can create a recipe of ingredients for your potion, or a list of instructions on how to make it. You could create a brand new spell, drawing a labelled diagram on how to complete it. You could even get an adult to help you research magic tricks and learn your own new magic trick.

4. Potato printing. Use a potato or other root vegetable to carve a shape and use paint to make a stamp. Get an adult to help you with the cutting. You could use multiple shapes or the same shape in different ways to create interesting patterns.
