- What are the items in Ms Hardbrooms pocket? How would you describe them if you were a frog?
- How does Mildred feel trapped in the jar? Why can't she get out?
- What do Mildred's friends think to the frog in the jar? Do they think it is unusual? How do you know?
- What does Mildred do to escape the girls trying to catch her in the laboratory?
- What is unusual about the frog in the pond? What does Mildred promise?
- Writing Challenge -

Imagine you have turned invisible. Describe what you would do and where you would go?

OR

Describe the havoc that occurs when the frog is jumping around the classroom.

3. Carnivals – Today we are looking at Brazil. The Portuguese first settled in the 1500's but there were also native Americans that lived there, and many other settlers from around the world. This mixture of different people and languages has meant that Brazil has a diverse range of cultures. Rio Carnival is a 5 day celebration in Brazil which attracts up to 2 million people a day. It is a festival that is held to mark the beginning of Lent. The Samba dancers all compete and dance together – highlighting the traditional Brazilian dance – celebrating Brazil's diverse heritage.

- Draw a picture of the Rio Carnival – include the Samba dancers and colourful carnival floats. Can you write a descriptive paragraph to go with it, including all 5 of your senses?
- Design a poster advertising Brazil and the Rio Carnival, telling people why they should visit.
- Research the traditional dances and learn some new dance moves.

4. Make your own clock. You only need paper or cardboard, a pin and some pens. You can make the clock as detailed or as simple as you like. Help a younger sibling learn how to tell the time.
